Run blocking: Is a dominant blocker at the point of attack. Shows the strength to drive the defender off the ball and open up big holes for the running back. When out in space, displays some stiffness in maneuvering and getting a block on a quicker defender. Is versatile; can also play guard. Grade: 8.5

Pass blocking: Shows athleticism and intelligence in widening the pocket with his footwork. Must improve quickness of his hand punch. Does a good job of stonewalling the defender once engaged. Grade: 8.5

Initial quickness: Displays a good burst out of his stance on run plays. Struggles to get to the corner and cut off edge rushers in pass protection. Shows excellent speed off the ball. Grade: 8.0

Strength: Showed excellent strength at the college level, which will make his transition to the NFL easier because of the hard work he put into the weight room. Must learn to play with better leverage. When playing with solid technique, can dominate defenders of all sizes. **Grade: 8.5**

Mobility: Shows good footwork along the line of scrimmage, but struggles once he breaks the

line. Loses his knee bend when downfield and gets high at times. Fails to move with great

agility to block quicker linebackers and defensive backs. Must do a better job seeing the field. Grade: 7.0

Overall, he must have done something right to keep the LT job at Virginia when B. Albert was relegated to playing LG.
